<i>Active Club Program (ACP)</i>	<p>The Active Club Program provides financial assistance to South Australian not for profit community-based active recreation and sporting organisations to develop and expand the services they provide, thereby increasing the community's access to quality active recreation and sport activities and facilities.</p> <p>The program has three types of grants:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1. Programs and Equipment</li> <li>2. Facility</li> <li>3. <p><i>Inclusive Recreation</i> <i>Inclusive Sport Program (IRIS)</i></p>	<p>The South Australian Government established the IRIS funding program to assist organisations increase and/or enhance opportunities for people with a disability to be involved in active recreation and sport.</p> <p>Funding will be offered under the following categories:</p> <p><u>Minor Projects</u> Up to \$5,000 per annum</p> <p><u>Major Projects</u> Between \$5,001 and \$50,000 per annum</p> <p><u>Top-Up Funding</u> State Sporting Organisations for People with Disabilities (SSODs) who receive Statewide Enhancement Program (StEP - Stream 1) funding can apply for additional financial assistance to conduct core business activities as identified in their strategic plans. Top-Up funding has been allocated for 2007-2010 through the Statewide Enhancement Program Assessment Process. Applications for this funding will open again in 2010-2013.</p> <p>Organisations can apply for grants to conduct projects that will primarily focus on increasing opportunities for people with disabilities to participate in sport and active recreation. Making Communities Active Program provides financial assistance to sport and active recreation organisations to run projects that target inactive people in South Australia.</p> <p>Projects that address groups with limited access and low participation rates in active recreation and sport (eg: children under the guardianship of the Minister, homeless/marginalised, etc) and the general inactive community will be considered.</p> <p>All applications will be assessed against the following criteria.  <u>The extent to which the project:</u></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Will increase participation in active recreation and sport</li> <li>• Will identify and address the barriers to participation in active recreation and sport</li> <li>• Develops sustainable partnerships with other stakeholders, and</li> <li>• Is viable and sustainable</li> </ul> <p style="text-align: right;">Applicants can apply for up to \$50,000 per year. <p><i>Local Sporting Champions Program</i></p>	<p>The Local Sporting Champions program is an Australian Government initiative designed to provide financial assistance for junior sportsmen and women towards the cost of travel, accommodation, uniforms or equipment when competing at an official national sporting organisation (NSO) endorsed state or national sporting competition.</p> <p>To be eligible to apply for a Local Sporting Champions grant, individuals and all team members must meet the following eligibility criteria:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• be between 12 and 18 years of age (inclusive) at the time of the nominated sporting competition</li> <li>• be participating as an athlete in an official state or national sporting competition which is endorsed by the relevant Australian Sports Commission recognised national sporting organisation (NSO), or national school sport competition. <p><i>Australian Sports Foundation - Sports Incentive Program</i></p>	<p>The Australian Sports Foundation (ASF) operates the Sport Incentive Program. Specifically the program aims to increase opportunities for Australians to participate in sport, and/or excel in sports performance. Eligible organisations can apply to register sport related projects in either of the following categories under the program:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Category 1 – to collect donations using the ASF's tax deductible status and to receive consideration for discretionary grants from the ASF, OR</li> <li>• Category 2 – to receive consideration for a discretionary grant from the ASF.</li> </ul> <p>An organisation can only register under one category at any given time. Projects must meet certain project criteria.</p> <p>Eligible organisations can apply to register either a Category 1 or a Category 2 project under the program for sport related projects. An organisational and project eligibility checklist can assist in the preparation of your application. There are some applications which will not be considered for ASF registration. In order to register you will need to contact us to obtain an application kit which includes a Sport Incentive Program application form and guidelines. Your application will require supporting documentation and a \$275 application fee (Category 1 projects only).</p> <p>Your application will be assessed and you will be notified in writing of the outcome.
